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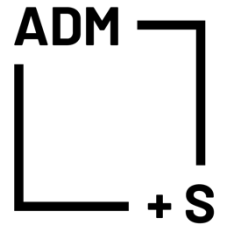

Do We Need Them?

“I’m just optimising my neural-based ranker using existing test collections (MS-MARCO). I just look at NDCG numbers, why should I need a positionality statement?”

- Where the relevance judgements come from?
- Your system wins the TREC Deep Learning Track, who benefits from it?

The value of positionality statements becomes more obvious when we move to other information access scenarios (e.g., fairness-aware ranking, crowdsourcing tasks, ...)



Decolonising Research

When Indigenous people become the researchers and not merely the researched, the activity of research is transformed. Questions are framed differently, priorities are ranked differently, problems are defined differently, people participate on different terms. (Smith 1999, cited in Zavala [1, p. 59])

- Decolonisation vs. Indigenisation
- Acknowledgement of Country (territorial ack.) vs. Welcome to Country

2. Pay respects to Ancestors and Elders, past and present
3. Respectfully acknowledge Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander/First Nations peoples that may be joining
4. [Optional] Positionality (who is acknowledging Country)/tell a relevant story/share how you feel connected to Country/..



Territorial Acknowledgement – SIGIR 2021

Before going fully virtual, SIGIR 2021 was planned to be located in Tiohtià:ke, also known as Montréal, and the island is called Mooniyang in Anishnabemowin. Tiohtià:ke/Montréal is situated on unceded Indigenous lands and traditional territory of the Kanien'kehá:ka and Anishnaabe Nations. We, the organizers and the conference attendees who are based in Tiohtià:ke/Montréal, recognize the Kanien'kehá:ka nation as the custodians of the lands and waters on which we stand. Tiohtià:ke has historically served as a meeting place for many First Nations. Today Tiohtià:ke/Montréal is home to a diverse population of Indigenous and other peoples. We again welcome our diverse group of attendees from across the world to join us virtually and to simultaneously acknowledge their own physical location and share their respective land acknowledgment, using tools like <https://native-land.ca/>.

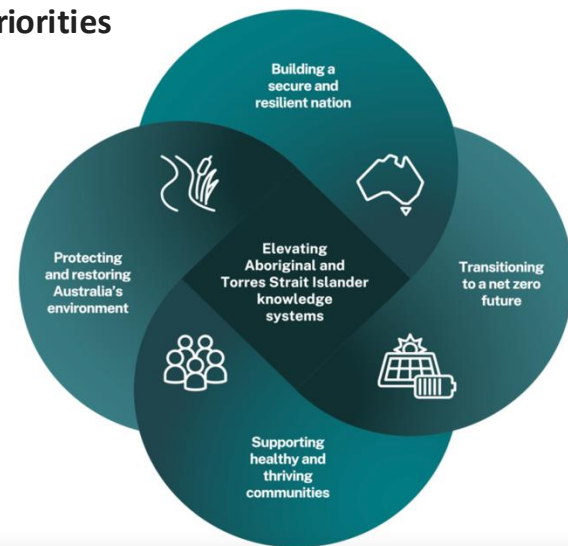
CALL FOR PRESENTATION PROPOSALS

Low-resource environments are characterised by limited access to resources, such as test collections for training or benchmarking Information Retrieval (IR) techniques, restricted access to research funding, or limited computing infrastructure. These environments can be found in low-income countries, and in underserved communities within middle- and high-income countries. Low-resource environments encompass the **places, people, and platforms** involved in accessing information. These environments present unique IR problems, requiring innovative solutions and new perspectives. However, the IR community, and SIGIR in particular, has seen limited work addressing these challenges, and limited participation by people working in low-resource environments.

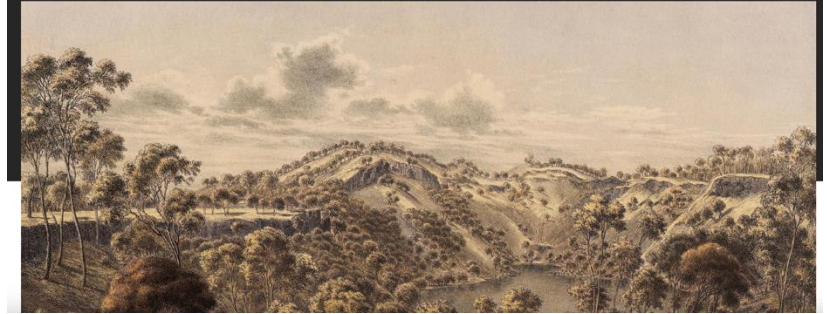

Some Mistakes I Made So Far

- Recording of didgeridoo & berimbau to acknowledge Wurundjeri & Bunurong Country
 - Clapsticks, possum skin drums, and voice are used in Kulin Nation
- Using Indigenous words without explicit permission (who is benefitting?)
- Not checking sensitivity of questions in a form to register an Indigenous artist as an RMIT supplier

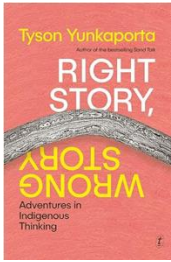

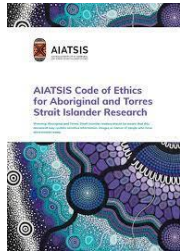

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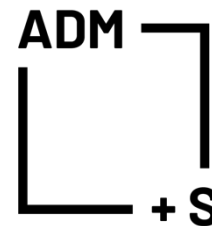
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
